The delegates are not allowed to travel independently from the delegation to, from or during the trip to Washington, D.C., except in the case of an emergency. In the event of an emergency, arrangements must be approved, and it will be coordinated through the New Mexico Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NMRECA).

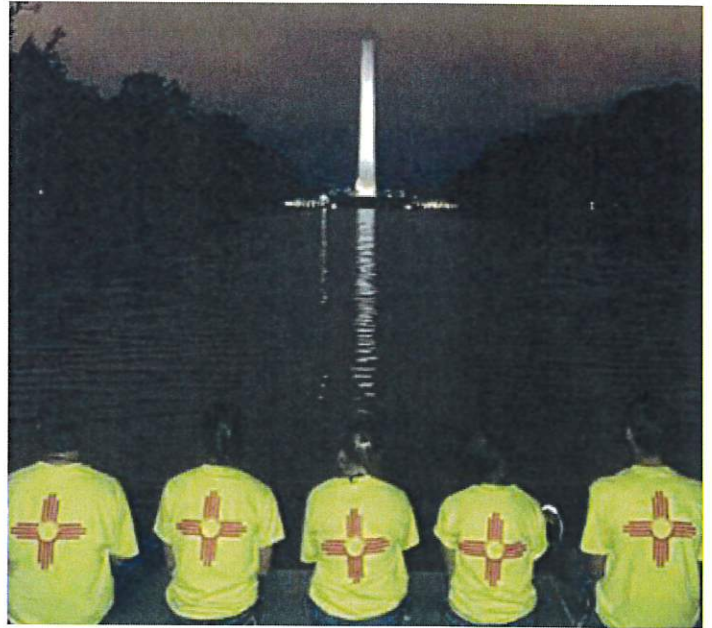
PARENT/GUARDIAN RELEASE

The New Mexico Rural Electric Cooperative Association arranges airline flights, hotel accommodations, meals, visits with federal and state lawmakers and schedules *many* educational and sight-seeing opportunities. The Youth Tour kicks off in Santa Fe where delegates meet top New Mexico lawmakers and tour our state's capitol building and other government offices. The Youth Tour delegation then makes its way to Albuquerque for an early morning flight to Washington, D.C.



Activities include:

- Visit to the offices of congressional representatives on Capitol Hill
- Discussions with legislators about current events
- Boat cruise on the Potomac River
- NRECA youth conference

Tours include:

- Smithsonian museums
- Washington National Cathedral
- Mount Vernon, plantation home of George Washington
- Arlington National Cemetery (and a wreath-laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier)
- Ford's Theatre, location of Abraham Lincoln's assassination
- And several other national monuments!

- The roles of our state and federal governments
