JMEC Completes its Office Move

The JMEC team rolled up their sleeves and, starting at the end of the day on Wednesday, October 13, began the work of moving our operations to the cooperative's new location in Espanola. The move required our communications system to be down throughout the co-op so we made sure to have notice of an alternate hotline number to call in case of an outage. We were delighted (and relieved!) that our IT pros were able to have all communications back up before the weekend. While the business was closed to members during the move, our crews were working as usual to maintain members' electrical service.

The new building replaces a facility built in 1961. An analysis determined that extensive renovations would be required for the 50-year-old structure to become ADA compliant, address HVAC and septic failures, remediate lead and asbestos contamination and meet use requirements. The new facility was budgeted and paid for out of the reserve cash the cooperative had at the time the project was conceived. It is debt free, and its development has had zero impact on our members' cost of service.

It was fun to welcome Emery Maestas who happened

to be the first JMEC member to walk in the door of the new facility when we opened on Monday, Oct. 18. To celebrate, Emery was offered \$25 toward his energy bill. We look forward to getting settled and serving all our members for another 50 years from this new office.
